DEAR CARE MEMBERS,

In coordination with Tri-State Generation and Transmission, the CARE Committee is happy to provide you with a 2020 Voter Guide. The intent of the 2020 Voter Guide is not to direct you how to vote, but rather help educate you on the candidates who are up for election November 3, 2020. The CARE Committee has been busy the last few months with interviewing candidates for elected office and making endorsements for candidates that will advocate for and strengthen the voice of Colorado's electric cooperatives.

The CARE Committee uses various criteria to evaluate candidates, including voting records, interviews, campaign literature, and public comments. It is much easier to evaluate an incumbent, as they have a voting record to review. New candidates for public office are difficult to evaluate, as positions change or evolve throughout the campaign and even after the election. The CREA Legislative team works with the CARE committee to meet with candidates - educating them about issues facing electric cooperatives.

Not all candidates endorsed by the CARE Committee represent areas served by an electric cooperative. However, all members of the General Assembly ultimately vote on legislation. It is essential to be active in competitive races to support a candidate that will support cooperative issues.

Regardless of how you vote come November 3, it is imperative to be part of the decisionmaking process in choosing our elected officials! Please reach out to CARE staff, Tim Coleman (TColeman@coloradorea.org), if you have any questions regarding the information in the 2020 Voter Guide.

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

JOE BIDEN (D)

While practicing law at a firm he also worked part time as a public defender. He was a member of the New Castle City Council and was elected to the United States Senate at the age of 29. 
VICE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

KAMALA HARRIS (D)

Kamala Harris graduated from Howard University and earned her law degree from the University of California, Hastings College of Law. She worked as an attorney in the Alameda County District Attorney's office prosecuting child sexual assault cases. She was elected as San Francisco's District Attorney and started a program to provide first time drug offenders second chances. She was elected California Attorney General managing a \$735 million budget and overseeing more than 4,800 employees. She was elected to the United States Senate in 2016 and serves on the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence and the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee.

MIKE PENCE (R) INCUMBENT

Mike Pence is the current Vice President. He was born in Columbus, Indiana. He earned a B.A. in history from Hanover College in 1981 and a J.D. from Indiana University in 1986. After graduating from law school he practiced as an attorney in private practice and later worked as the President of the Indiana Policy Review Foundation. In 1994, Pence left to begin a career in talk radio and host a political talk show in Indianapolis. In 2000, Pence was elected to serve in the U.S. House of Representatives where he served for 12 years. Pence was elected Indiana's Governor in 2012. He and his wife Karen have three children.

JOHN HICKENLOOPER (D)

John Hickenlooper is a former Governor of Colorado and former Mayor of the City of Denver. Originally a geologist, Hickenlooper moved on to become a small business owner, opening Colorado's first brew pub in downtown Denver and opening seven more businesses after that. JOE NEGUSE (D) INCUMBENT, ACRE SUPPORTED

Joe Neguse is the first and only African American to serve in Congress in Colorado's history. Neguse is currently the youngest member of Colorado's congressional delegation, and serves as a Vice-Chair of the Congressional Progressive Caucus, a Vice-Chair of the Medicare-for-All Caucus, and was elected by his peers to serve as a member of the House Democratic Leadership. Neguse has lived in Colorado's 2nd Congressional District for 18 years and he and his wife, Andrea, currently live in Lafayette. Prior to serving in Congress, Neguse was a member of Colorado University's Board of Regents from 2009 – 2015, and lead Colorado's consumer protection agency at the age of 31. Neguse received undergraduate and law degrees from the University of Colorado and co-founded New Era Colorado focused on youth voter registration. Neguse's parents immigrated to Colorado from Eritrea.







You can register to vote or ensure your voter registration is up to date by vising the Colorado Secretary of State website at: <u>www.GoVoteColorado.gov</u>.

In Colorado you can register to vote up to and on Election Day, however you will need to register by Monday, October 26 in order to receive a ballot by mail. If you register after October 26 you can still vote in person at a voter service and polling center.

All Colorado voters with an active voter registration will automatically receive a ballot by mail at the address shown on your registration. If you prefer to vote at the polls, you can vote in-person at a voter service and polling center. Please visit www.GoVoteColorado.gov to find your polling locations.

If you plan to mail in your ballot, ensure there is enough postage. If you prefer to drop off your ballot in person, you candosoatavoterserviceandpollingcenter. **Pleasenote, ballotsmustbereceived(notpost-marked)by7p.m.onTuesday, November 3 to be counted.**

Be sure to sign the envelope when you return your mail ballot. If you are not sure if your ballot will arrive in time, drop it off in person. Contact your county clerk and recorder for drop-off and drop-box locations. If you recently registered for the first time, you may need to provide a copy of your ID along with your mail ballot. Your county clerk will have provided instructions about the ID requirement along with your ballot

Below are some important dates for the 2020 General Election:

- October 9: Counties will begin mailing ballots for the 2020 General Election
- October 19: County Drop Boxes open to accept mail ballots for the General Election
- October 26: Deadline to register to vote or update your registration and still receive a ballot in the mail.

CREA: The Colorado Rural Electric Association (CREA) is the membership association for Colorado's rural electric cooperatives and affiliates, like Tri-State. CREA's mission is to enhance and advance the interests of its member electric cooperatives through a united effort.

ACRE: The Action Committee for Rural Electrification (ACRE) is a federal Political Action Committee (PAC) administered by NRECA that supports congressional candidates.

CARE: State-level PAC administered by CREA. Funds disbursed from CARE are used for candidates running for the Colorado General Assembly and statewide offices. CARE money cannot be used for local or county candidates. Decisions to support Colorado General Assembly candidates are made by the CARE Committee, which is composed of seven people representing electric cooperatives from across Colorado. Decisions to support candidates for the U.S. House and U.S. Senate are made by the CARE Committee in conjunction with staff at ACRE.


